About the Artist...

YAN (JOHN) SUN is an assistant professor of art at Muskingum College. His works are featured in the permanent collections of the Hayden Museum of American Art, the Museum of East Texas, the Franklin Museum, Washington College, the Malaysia Art Institute, the La Jolla Art Foundation, the Muskingum County Community Foundation, and in private collections both here and abroad.

John Sun, a native of China, has taught at Muskingum College since August of 1997. Before accepting his current position, he taught at Texas A & M University in Commerce, Texas; served as art director of the Oriental Arts Center in Chicago, Illinois; and as an assistant and visiting professor at three institutions of higher education in China. In 2001, John Sun was presented with the William Oxley Thompson Award for Excellence in Teaching, an award named in honor of an alumnus of Muskingum College whose career encompassed teaching, ministry, and service as president of Miami University and president of The Ohio State University.

John Sun combines the recognized achievement of excellent teaching with an extraordinary talent. His technical mastery of paint on canvas is infused with a vision that sometimes startles and often leaves one surfeit with visual pleasure...yet elevated and enlightened by the presence of and ownership by the artist of each image he creates.

John Sun, teacher and artist, shares his gifts with our community. He has participated in the Art Walks sponsored each spring through 2001 by the Community Foundation. His venue was National City Bank whose Richard Duncan first requested John Sun's participation. John is a member of ZAAP, the Zanesville Appalachian Arts Project, and an artist who has added beauty to the Muskingum Valley through his works and through his kindness and generosity.

John Sun is a major contributor to the Muskingum County Community Foundation. Through his portraits of the presidents of the Community Foundation and his portraits of artists Leslie Cope and Charles Dietz, we have a gallery of our community's greatest citizens. We have a gallery of past and present heroes.

John Sun, here, far from his familiar land, is one of the people who makes Muskingum County a place of beauty, a place where heroes can be gentle and kind.

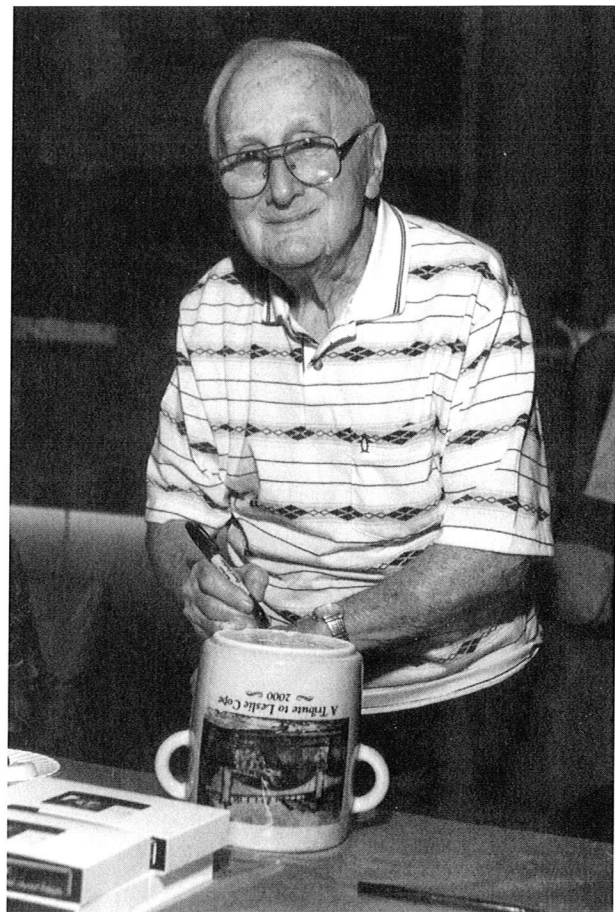

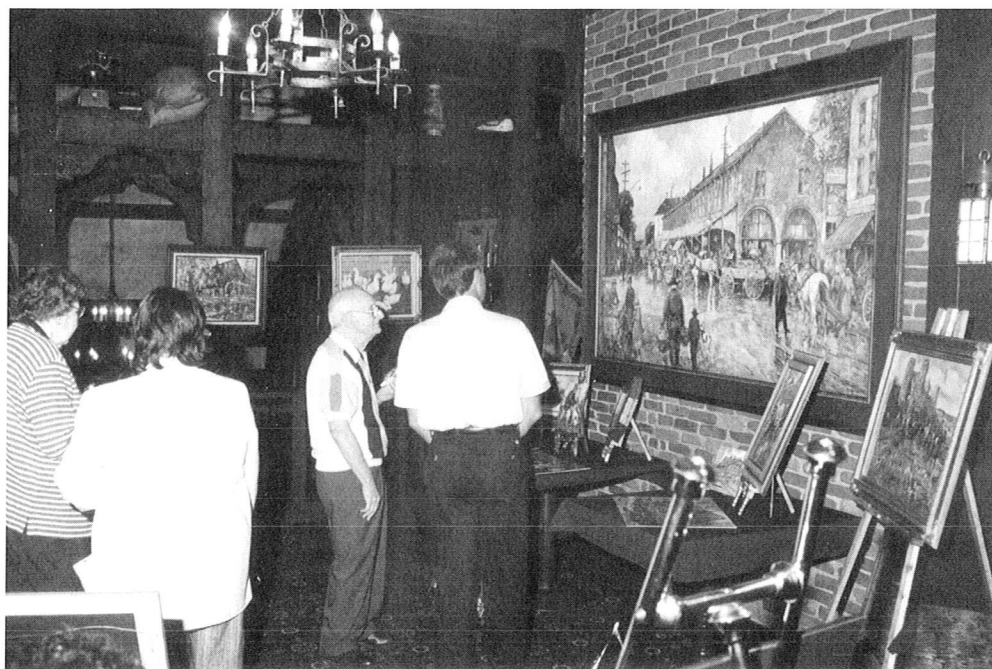

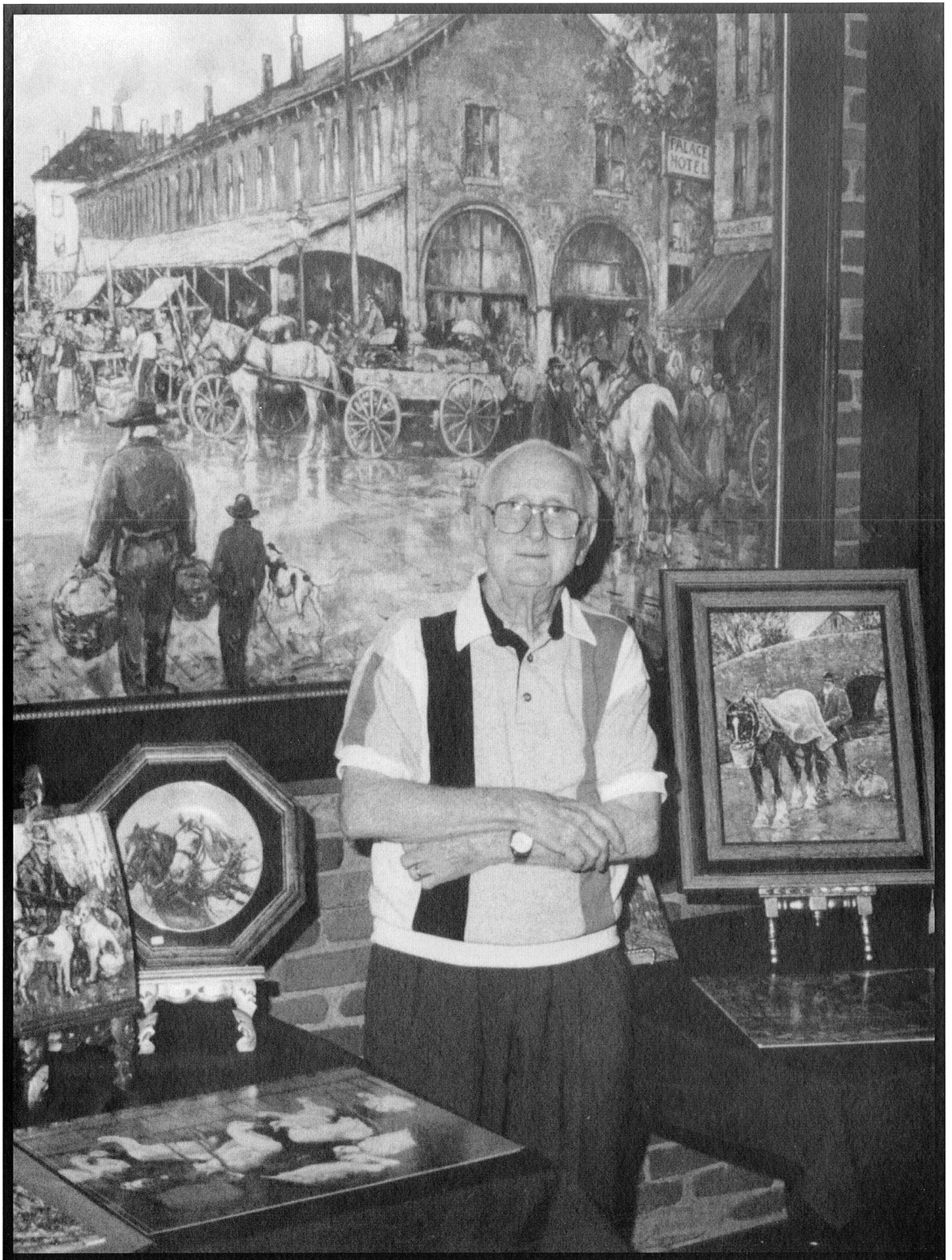

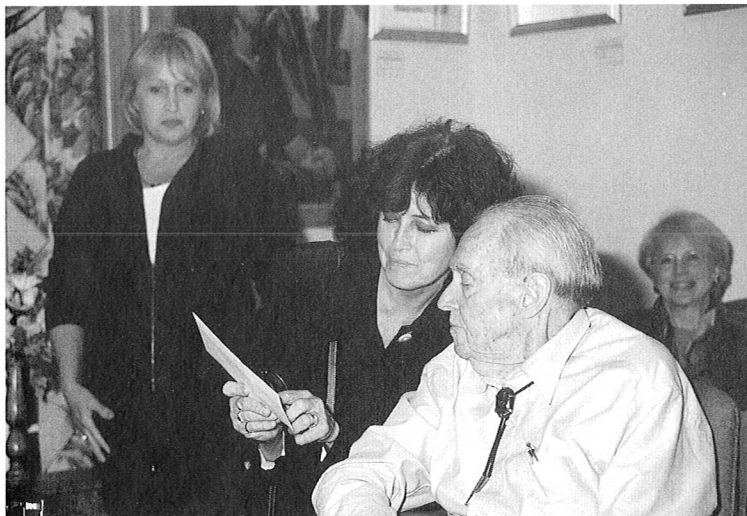


Your reading of these pages is bound to be uplifting, thanks to tenacious leadership of the directors and committees involved with these projects.

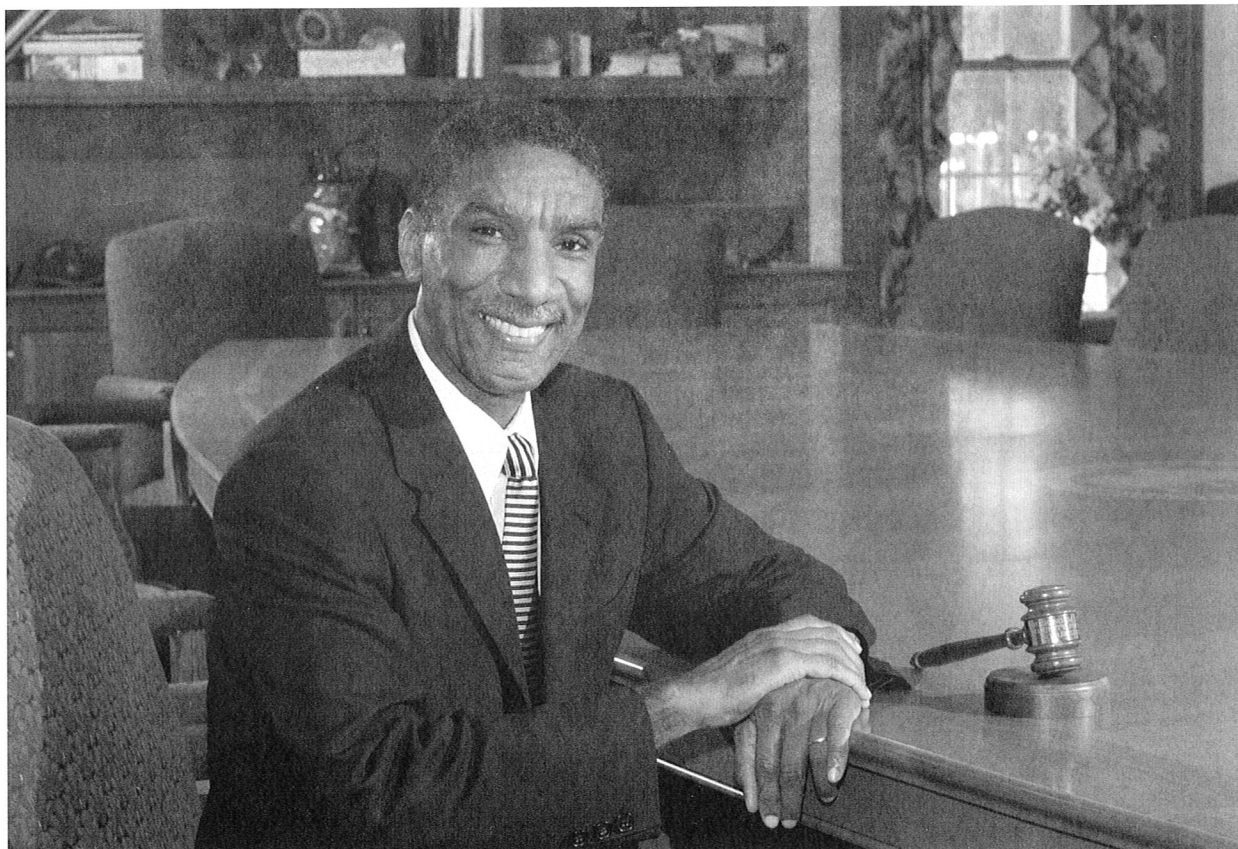

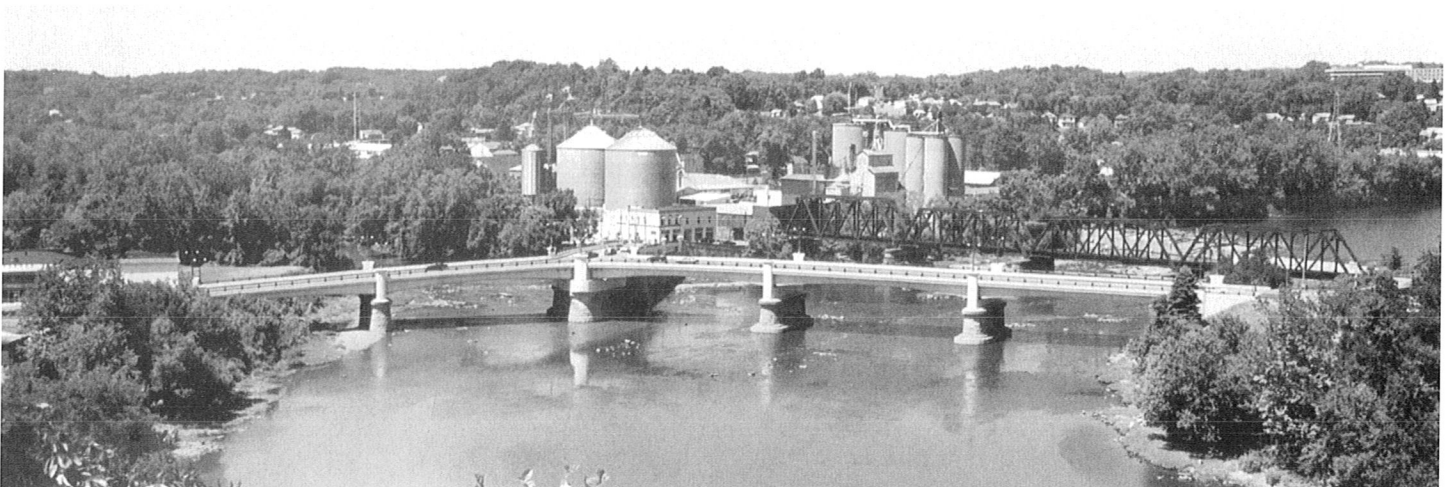
Because the IRS has designated us a public charity, contributions are eligible for the highest available tax deductions.

The Foundation is accountable to the public and publishes an annual report, files annual tax returns and obtains an annual independent audit.



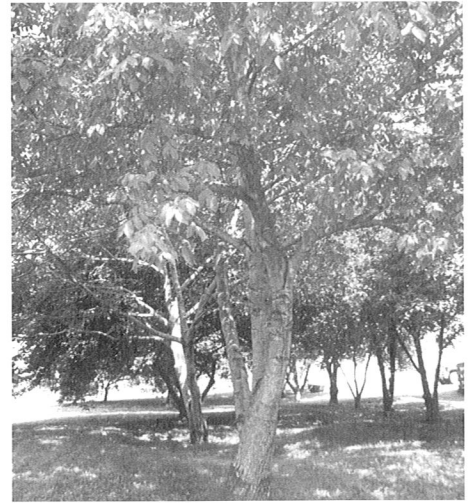

Creating a Fund is Simple

You can create a fund in honor of someone you love or to celebrate a special event. You can direct your gift broadly or narrowly to the issues you care about or to wherever the needs are greatest. Our professional staff will show you how simple it is.

Designated Funds endow a specific organization or charitable purpose. The Foundation ensures that grants to these groups remain relevant over time and responsive to changing circumstances.

Donor Advised Funds allow the donor to have a "charitable checking account" with a tax deduction now and for future gifts to organizations the donor recommends.

Field of Interest Funds provide grants that meet needs in a specific field or geographic area that is of interest to the donor.

Organization Endowment Funds are established by nonprofit organizations to provide income to the organization. The Foundation provides the organization with all of the benefits of endowed funds and relieves it of the burden of administrative, investment, and tax reporting responsibilities.

Scholarship Funds help students pursue academic goals. Donors establish specific criteria and may have the opportunity to participate in the selection of recipients.

Unrestricted Funds offer the broadest giving option, allowing the Foundation to make discretionary grants in response to community needs.

The Muskingum County Community Foundation staff assists donors in exploring options for gifts that give back to our community, while enabling donors to optimize financial resources for themselves and their families.

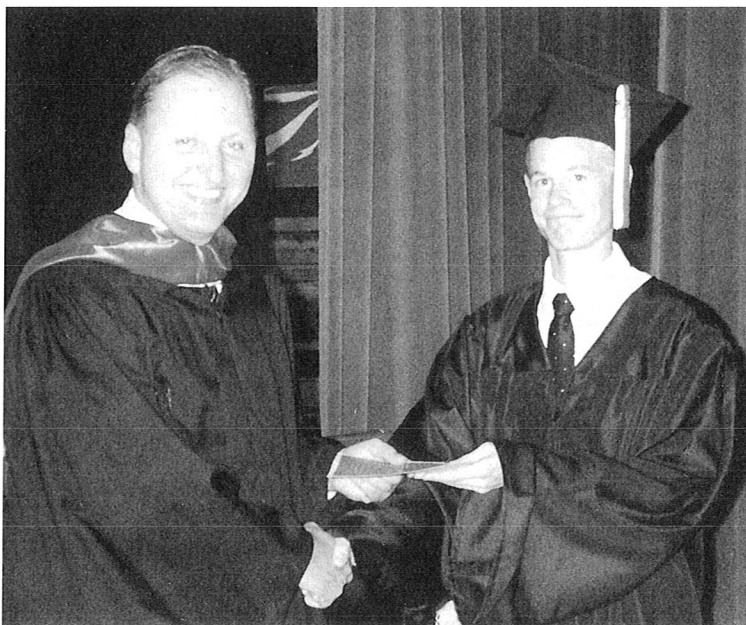

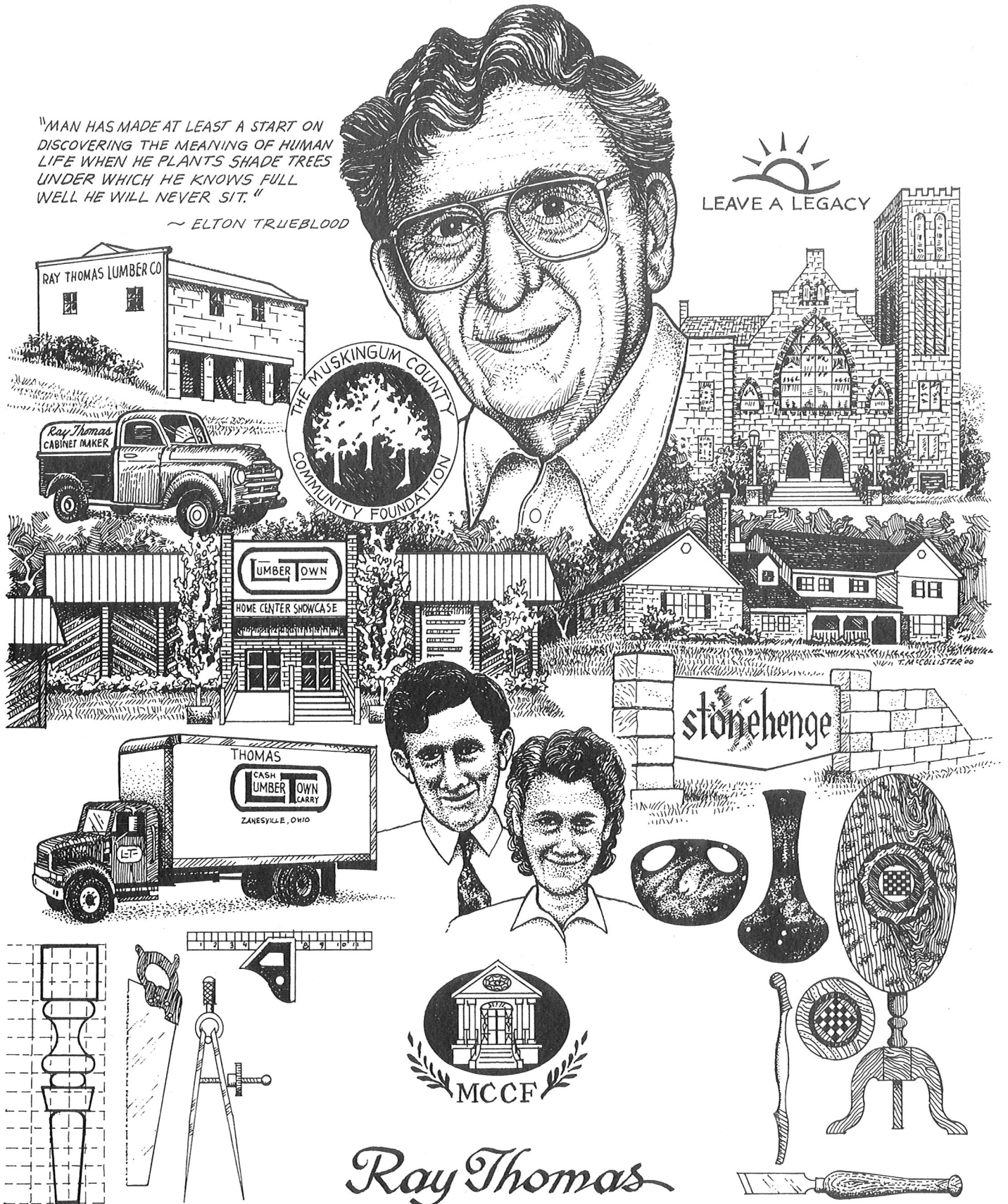

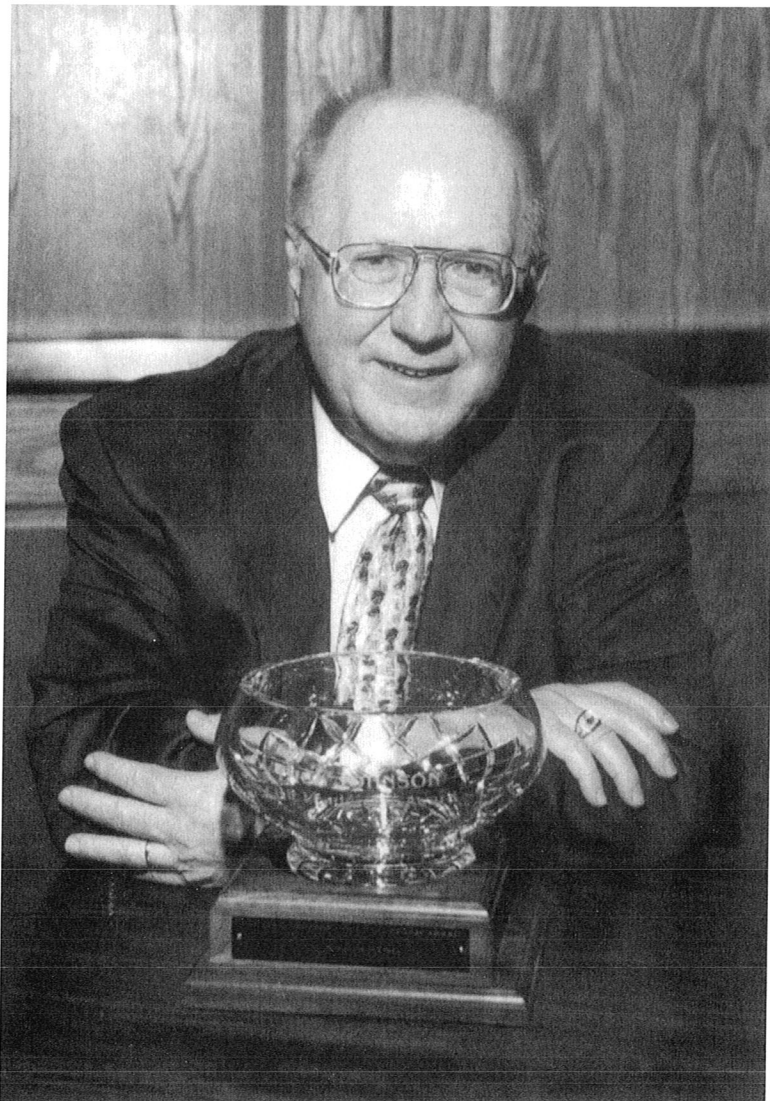

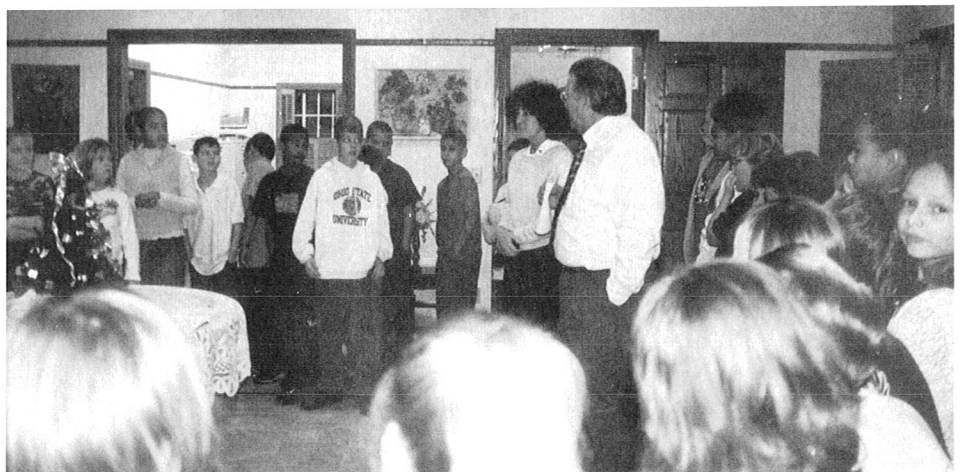

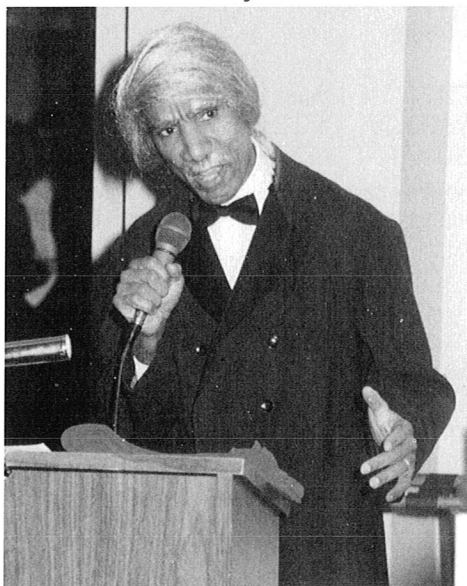

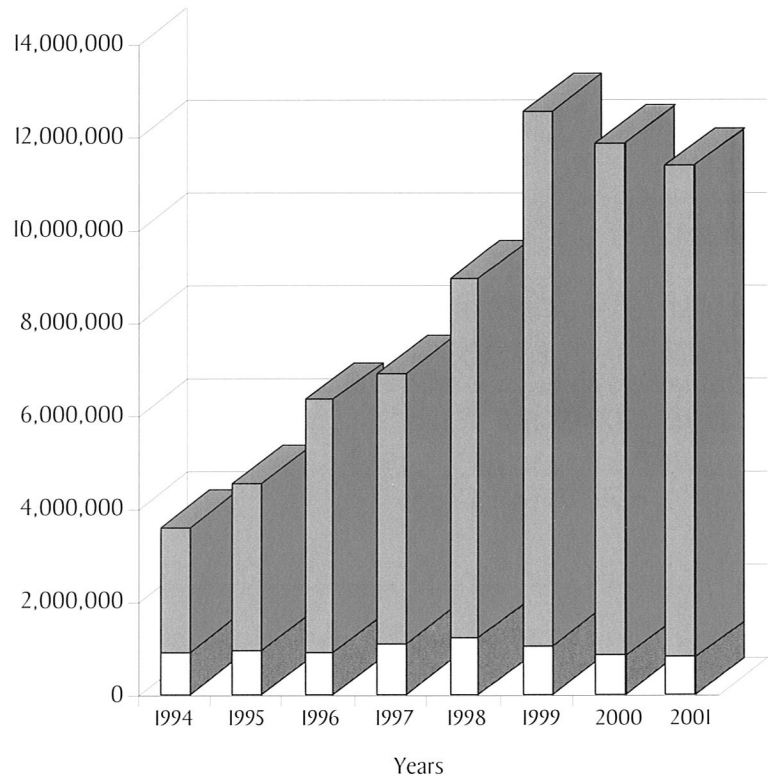
The Foundation owns property and equipment, pledges receivable, and life insurance policies. Grants are generally made from earnings on Endowment funds, which are designed to grow the principal of the fund by spending only interest and dividends. Most of the Foundation's component funds are endowments established to benefit a variety of local charities. While half of the Foundation's endowment funds are designated funds, an additional 30% are used to provide scholarships for Muskingum County residents. Seventeen percent of these endowment funds were established to benefit the Foundation, to ensure it will be here forever, continually benefiting the community.



Donors are offered many choices when giving to the Foundation. The most common gifts are cash, checks, life insurance policies, real estate, services, and stocks. Donors may specify how they want their gifts to benefit the community. As a donor, you can:

- Contribute to donor advised funds and suggest a variety of organizations to benefit from your generosity.
- Specify that your gift will benefit a specific cause or field of interest.
- Give to designated funds, which permanently restrict the beneficiaries to specific non-profit organizations or agencies, including the Foundation itself.
- Donate to funds used solely for local scholarships.
- As a non-profit, establish an agency or organization fund that will return endowment earnings to the organization itself.

Grants Awarded

Since 1988, the Muskingum County Community Foundation has distributed more than \$3,620,000 in grants to local organizations for projects and programs that enhance the quality of life in Muskingum County. These grants are funded by the Foundation's **Restricted** and **Unrestricted Funds**. These grants are made possible through people like you who desire to make a difference in our community today and tomorrow.

Restricted Funds include donor advised, field of interest, scholarship, endowment, and designated funds. They allow donors to identify specific organizations or areas of interest they want to benefit from their giving.

How to Apply for a Grant

Unrestricted Funds enable the Foundation to host two grant competitions each year. Deadlines are April 1st and October 1st. Awards in grant competitions for 2001 totaled \$55,000 and ranged from \$1,000 to \$12,500 for various projects and programs in Muskingum County.

When awarding grants, we look for organizations and projects that help build a healthy community. Improving the quality of life in Muskingum County is the primary goal of the Foundation's grant making.
