HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES SHOULD MAKE CAREFUL NOTE OF THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IF THEY DESIRE TO MAKE APPLICATION FOR A SHINNICK LOAN:

The student and parents (or legal guardian) must be established residents of Muskingum County. Never can a student or parent establish residence or register to vote in another county and still qualify for a Shinnick Loan. Before making application, a student must have:

1. A copy of his/her grade transcript, showing his/her accumulative grade point average to accompany his/her application.
2. Know where he/she will be attending college.
3. Know the cost per school year for tuition, room, board, and books.
4. Know what portion of these expenses he/she will be paying.
5. Know how much his/her parents will contribute.
6. Know the source and dollar amount of any approved loans, grants, scholarships, work study, and all other funds to be applied toward school expenses.
7. Names of 2 references, with mailing addresses, will be listed on the application. The first must be his/her Guidance Counselor; the second is not to be school connected or a close relative. We suggest pastor, Rabbi, employer, long-time neighbor, or friend.

When all facts and figures are known, the student should telephone The Shinnick Office at 740 452-2273 for an appointment. Appointments are scheduled from between 9:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday; the office is CLOSED on Friday and Saturday. Before any request for a Shinnick Loan can be submitted to the Board of Trustees, we must have a fully completed application, grade transcript with accumulative grade point average, a financial statement from the parents, and answers from the references.

New applications for the upcoming academic school year will be taken in the months of June and July.

THE SHINNICK FUND

The William M. Shinnick Educational Fund is a permanent endowment to assist worthy young people, who otherwise would be unable to secure a college or post high school education.

The Fund is administered by a Board of Trustees, appointed by Bank One of Zanesville, Ohio in accordance with a trust established by Mr. William M. Shinnick, one of Zanesville's greatest benefactors.

It was Mr. Shinnick's desire that money be loaned to needy students of Muskingum County, with repayment guaranteed by the parent or guardian.

The final decision regarding each application for a loan is made by the Board of Trustees. The decision is based upon the student's financial need, scholastic standing, and general qualifications.

HOW TO APPLY

The student (and parent, if possible) should visit the office for an interview. The student will be expected to submit a formal application, grades, references, and a financial statement of the parents. If assistance is required for more than one year, the student must submit grades and re-apply each year.

WHEN TO APPLY

Students should apply as soon as grade transcripts are available and all other financial aid has been determined. Applications will be submitted to the Board at the next reviewing date. Meetings for the purpose of reviewing applications are held periodically during the year.

AMOUNT

The amount which a student may borrow in one school year must not exceed the total loan limits currently established by the Board.

NOTES

Each time a student required funds, he and his co-signer, a parent or guardian, must appear at the office to execute a Cognovit Note.

REPAYMENT

Notes will mature according to the dates of issue. If a note is not paid when due, interest will be charged as prescribed in the note.
