Although all four brothers now live in various parts of the United States, we grew up in Zanesville, graduated from Zanesville High School, consider Zanesville our "hometown", and continue to remember the ever-lasting values, philosophies, educational requirements, work ethic, and life experiences our parents provided us.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- A. Applicant is currently a senior student graduating in 2023 from Zanesville High School with an accumulated minimum 3.00 grade point average.
- B. Applicant is in good standing with high ethical standards at Zanesville High School and in the Zanesville Community and will be disqualified or have the scholarship revoked if any of applicant's past or present conduct or actions are deemed unethical, irresponsible, inappropriate, or illegal.
- C. Applicant will enroll as a part-time or full-time student in 2023 or 2024 at an accredited school (such as, but not limited to college, university, community college, trade school, vocational school, art school, music school, theater school, and etc.) to continue their education.
- D. If awarded a scholarship, applicant agrees to exclusively use scholarship funds to pay for expenses directly related to their continued 2023 or 2024 educational expenses (such as tuition, room, meals, books, fees, travel to / from home, and etc.).
- E. By signing and submitting Page 2 of 2 of the 2023 scholarship application, applicant and applicant's parent or guardian agree to:
 1. Accurately provide and unconditionally release all requested information to members of the Justin and Maryan Dantonio Memorial Scholarship Organization.
 2. Permit applicant's name, picture, and other relevant personal information be publicly released by the Justin and Maryan Dantonio Memorial Scholarship Organization.

4. Letter of Recommendation from a current or previous Zanesville Middle School (or another middle school) employee.
5. Letter of Recommendation from a non-relative person currently or previously living or working in the Zanesville Community.
6. Your high school resume describing your significant school, extracurricular, community, religious, athletic, and academic activities, honors, awards, and other accomplishments.
7. On a single page in 400 words or less, describe the most difficult issue you have faced in your life and how you addressed this issue.
8. On a single page in 400 words or less, describe what you do for enjoyment, why this scholarship is important to you, and what are your future career goals.
